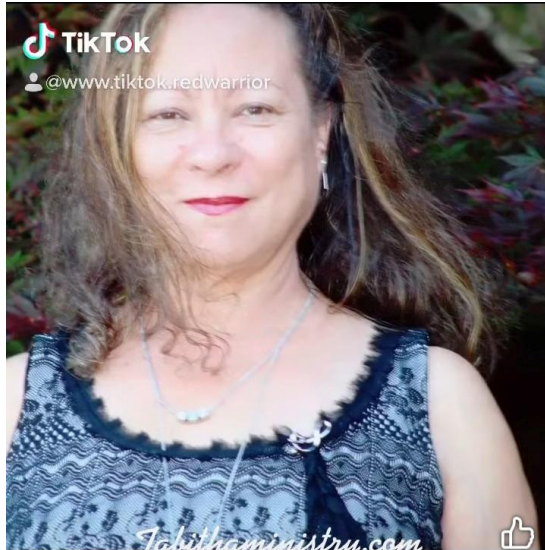

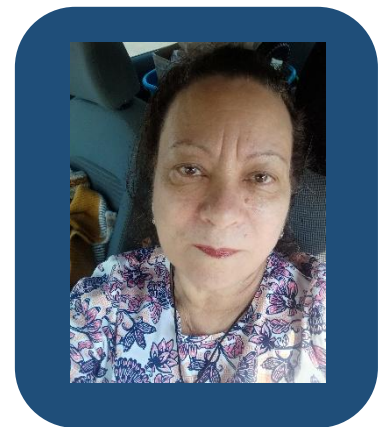


Can Jesus pull us out of a prison of isolation and into God's presence?

When Joyce gave her heart to Jesus in 2001, God began healing her relationship with her mother. But when her mother passed away from cancer in 2009, she lost herself. Her pain drove her to isolate herself from God and the world around her. She threw herself into work, wandered aimlessly, and recoiled deeper into her own cell of isolation, with drugs and alcohol as her only traveling companions.

When Joyce came to Tabitha Ministry in 2019, she believed she was broken beyond repair as she struggled with unresolved hurts and regrets wrapped up in shame. She was a complete mess inside with no light in sight. The isolation she sought to protect herself plunged her into complete darkness. **OH, BUT GOD!!** Tabitha Ministry founder Cindi Wagner, Joyce's spiritual mom, began ministering through Joyce's self-protective shell from God's Word that became a lamp to her feet and a light to her path (Ps. 119:105).

Joyce's life-path journey since graduating from the residential program in 2020 looks very different. Since graduation, God has continued to be Joyce's rescuer because **He sees her**. He has led her through many difficult seasons of her journey, and He continues to draw her out when she wants to hide in her shell of isolation. Today, Joyce works in a nonprofit's thrift store and attends a Southern Baptist Church, where she feels connected with the pastor and church family. She is no longer isolated. In fact, God has led Joyce to various situations over the years where He has repeatedly called her to minister to hurting women. Joyce now gently invites others out of their prisons and into God's presence.
